Last week, all children worked on their contributions for the Remembrance Day Exhibition at Ryton Village Hall. There was some very positive feedback from the local community, especially the History Group.

Having spent the last few days selling poppies for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal, we will soon find out how much money we raised.

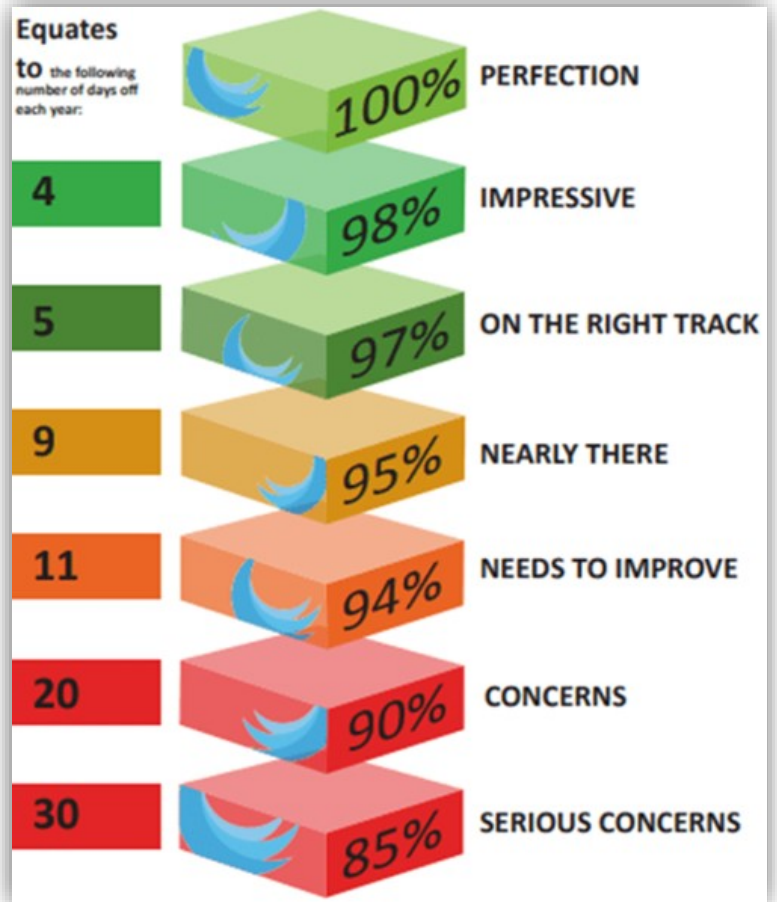
