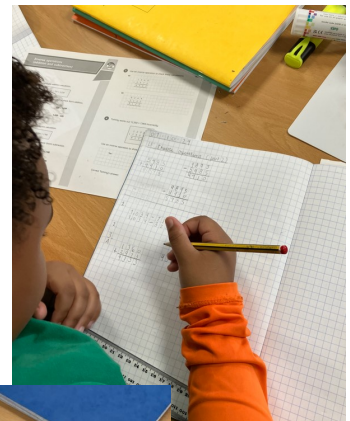
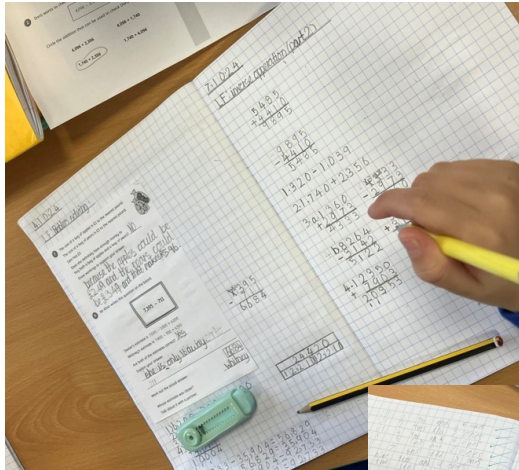
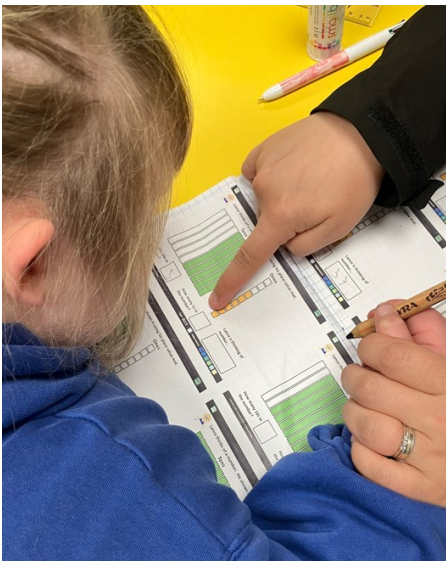


We had a great response the first PTA Movie Night today.

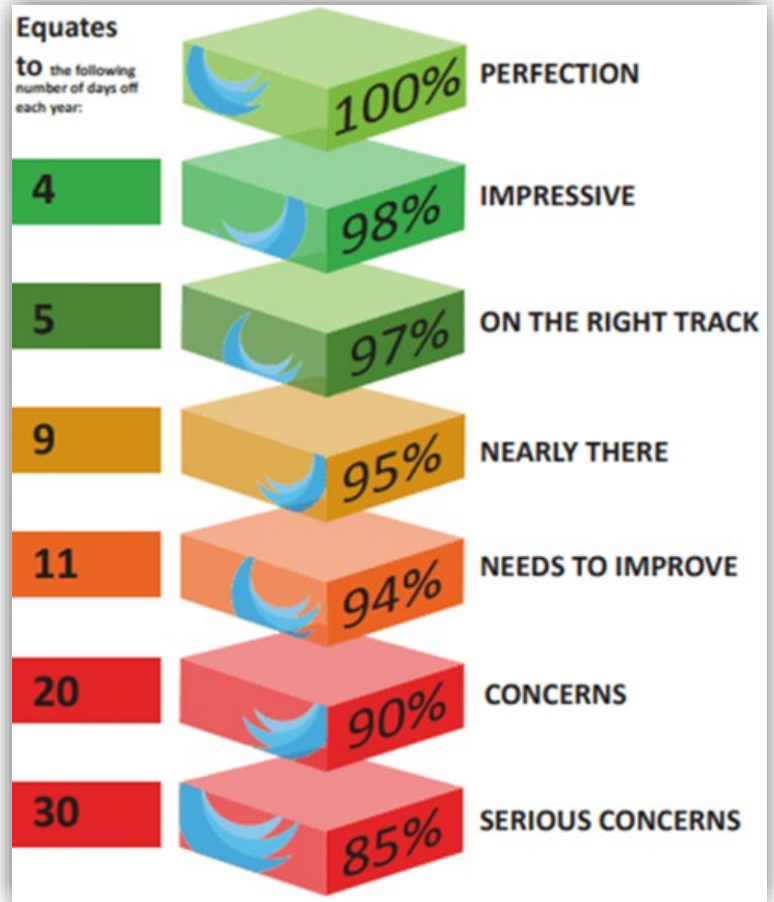

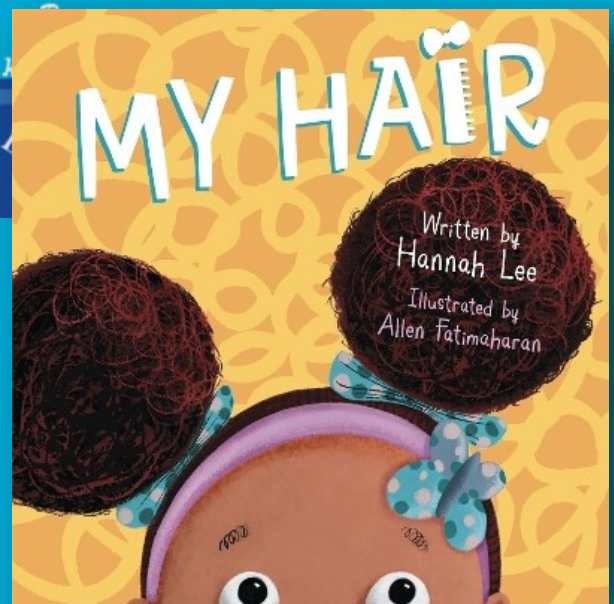
