On Wednesday, all the children were able to spend the day with their new class teacher and Year 6 attended their new secondary school. This time of year can sometimes be quite a worrying time for both children and parents alike, as change offers a level of uncertainty. As I walked around school on Wednesday, it was wonderful to see the calm and focused work of all of the children, and in some of our classes the collaborative work between our mixed year groups. As a staff team, we are very much looking forward to next year and the plans are in place to ensure we have another fantastic year.

Today, you will have received your child's school report, in our new format. One of the most important parts of the report for staff is the effort of the children. We know that all children develop their understanding at different rates, and not all children will be meeting their current year group's expectations. This, however, does not mean that the children have not made progress or do not try - in fact it can be the very opposite. As a school, we are very proud of each and every one of the children at Ryton and the progress the school has made over the past two years is clear from our statutory results this year. Our results are in line with national in Early Years and Year 6 with Year 1 phonics being about national with 88% of our children passing their phonics screening. This is testament to the children's focus and effort and the teaching of phonics across the school.

Finally, we said a goodbye to Mrs Baddeley as she has finished her role as our Executive Headteacher. It was lovely for the children to say goodbye and thank you for all that Mrs Baddeley has done for the school. She will be greatly missed.

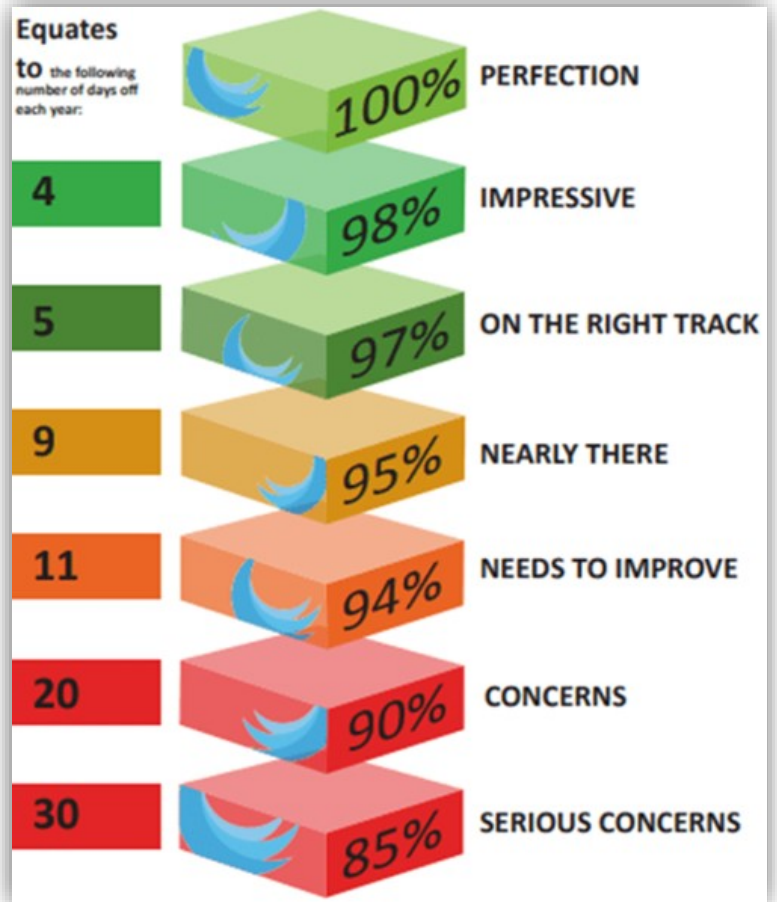

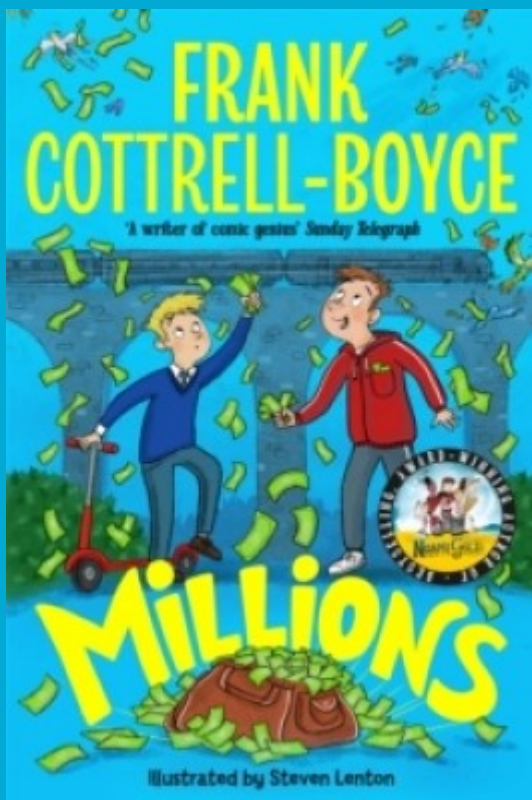
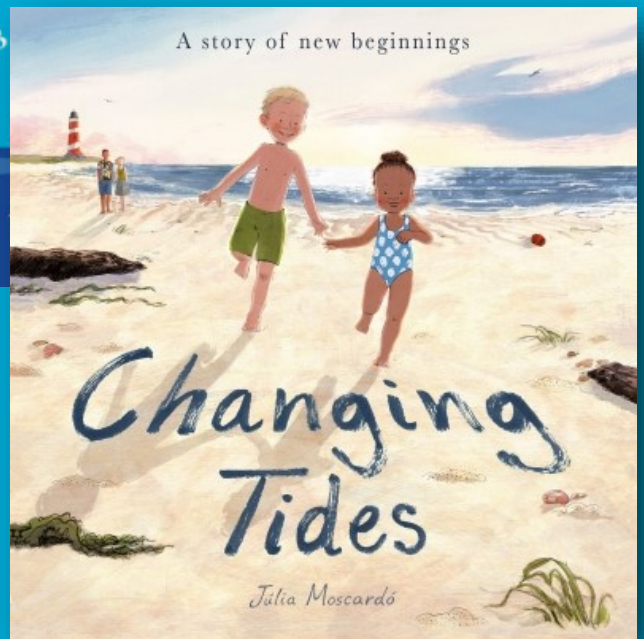
