Mrs Lampe Cullen's Recommended Reads

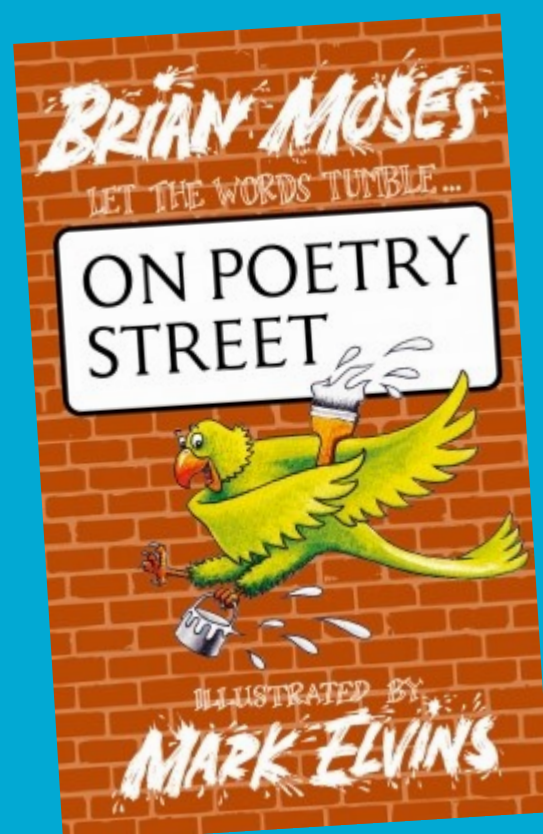
