"Let your light shine"



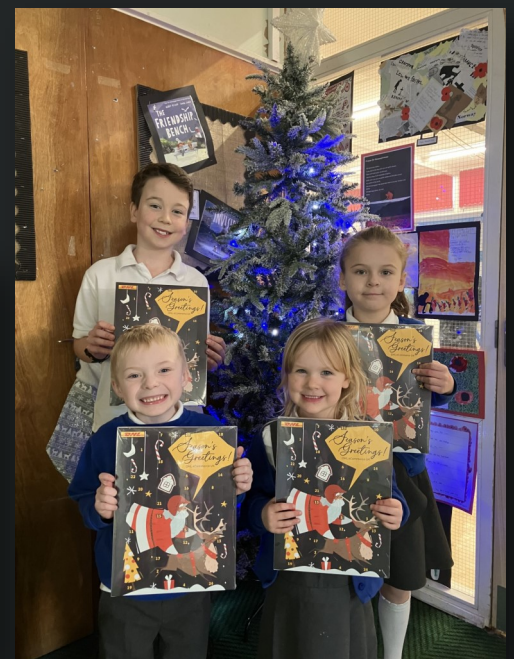

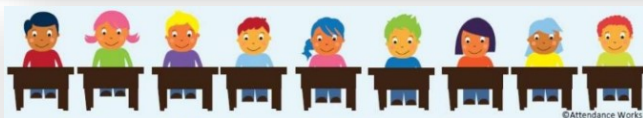
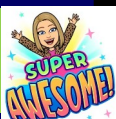

Finally it's Winter turn to share her special season, and she's SO excited. But her friends don't like her chilly games.

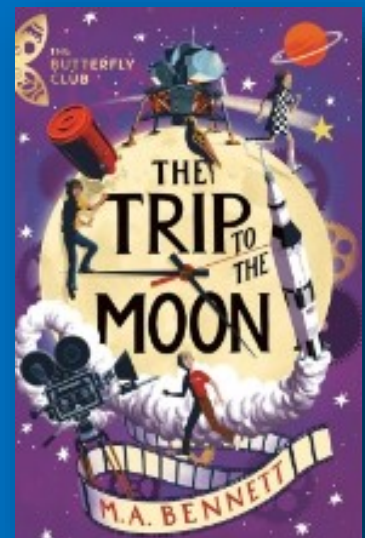

Once you have made an account click on -> Book an Appointment and search for CWP in location -> Search

You will then see CWP Schools Immunisation Clinics - select Jepson House Nuneaton Clinics /Locke House Rugby Clinics/ South Warwickshire/City of Coventry Health Centre - > Book an appointment

Click on the green 'School questionnaire tab' and type in your child's school -> Submit details -> next -> Select Immunisation-> select your preferred time and date -> next -> tick the Terms & Conditions boxes -> confirm.

Once you have made your appointment, you will receive an email and text confirmation.
