Last week I shared our Values and Etiquette which underpins our Behaviour for Learning Policy.

As a staff team, we believe that it is very important to have clear expectations of how we want all children to behave in school.

All children have the right to be safe, learn, and be treated with respect. We expect every member of our school community to behave in a thoughtful and respectful way towards others and for everyone to model considerate behaviour at all times.

We believe that it is very important for the children who behave well each day to be recognised and rewarded for their good behaviour.

All children will be rewarded for good behaviour, good manners and a positive attitude. This is through Dojo and Gold Certificates.

Sometimes however, not all behaviour meets the expectation of our school. All staff will follow the policy and when behaviour does not meet our expectations pupils will move along our behaviour charts. All staff will try to support children in order to make it back to 'Green' as this is where learning happens. If, however, a pupils receives a Red Consequence, they will miss up to 10 minutes of their break or lunch time. For more serious breach of our policy, pupils could receive a White Consequence. If a pupil receives three White Consequences in a week, there may be further consequences.

Children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are offered fruit or vegetables as a mid morning snack provided by the Government's Free Fruit and Vegetables Scheme. This varies but is often apples, bananas, vine tomatoes, pears etc.

Parents of children in these classes and older children (who don't receive free fruit) can send a snack in for mid morning but these must be limited to healthy fruit/vegetables.

Children are not allowed to eat biscuits, cakes etc. as a mid-morning snack. Fruit and vegetables are ideal because as well as having vitamins and fibre, there is also no litter.

If your child has a specific medical need requiring them to eat different snacks, please contact the office immediately.

Parents are also reminded that water bottles should only contain water, not squash/juice/flavoured water.

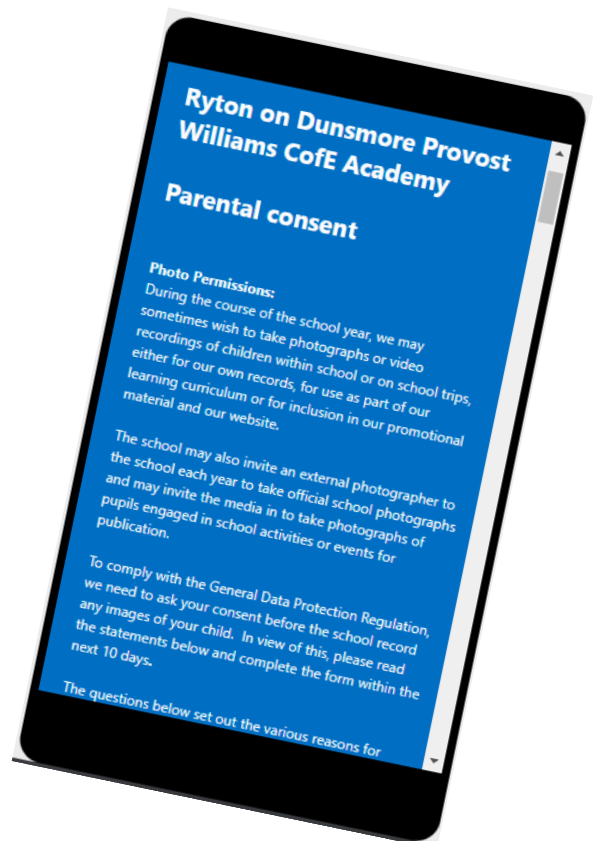

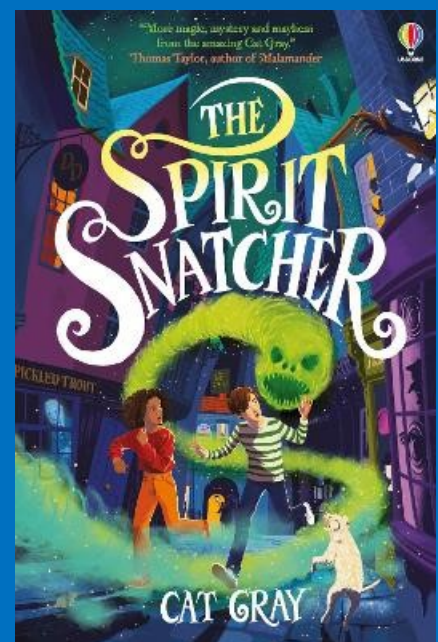
Mrs Lampe Cullen's Recommended Reads
