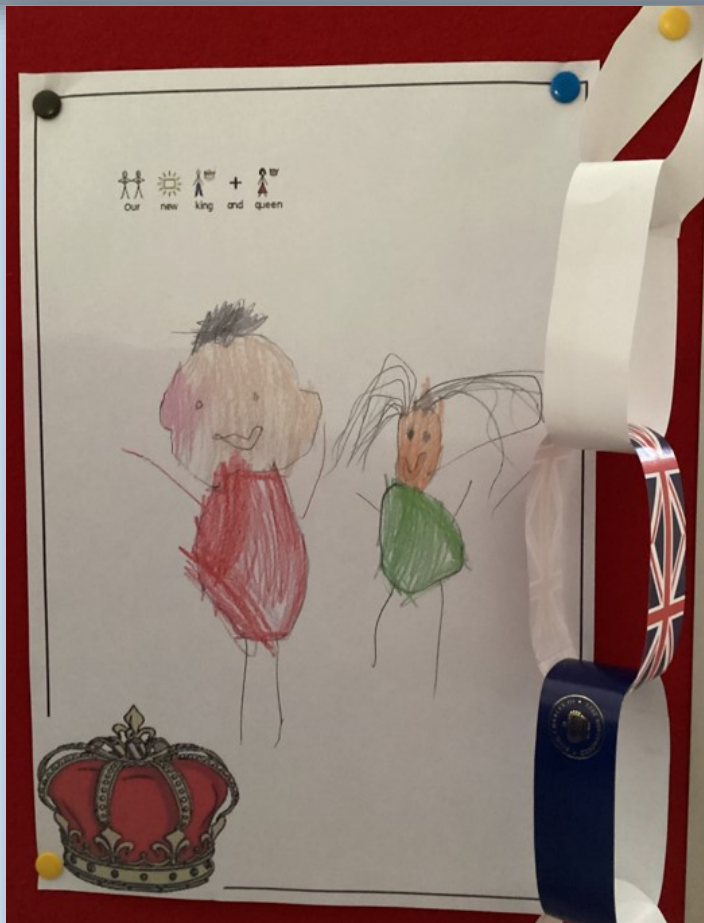
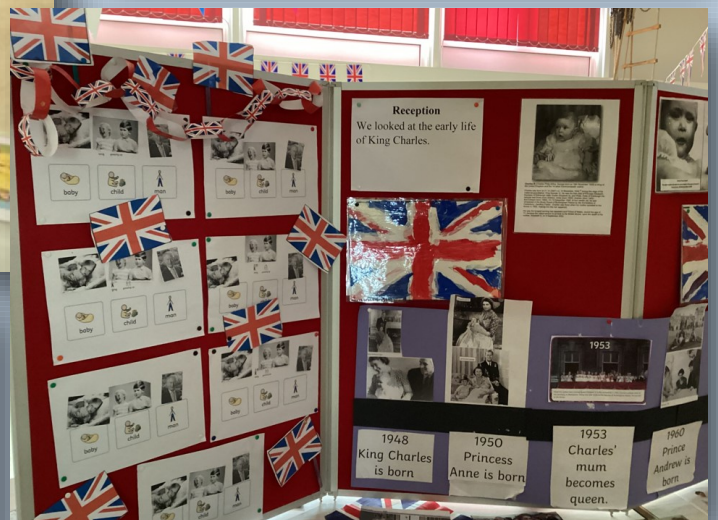
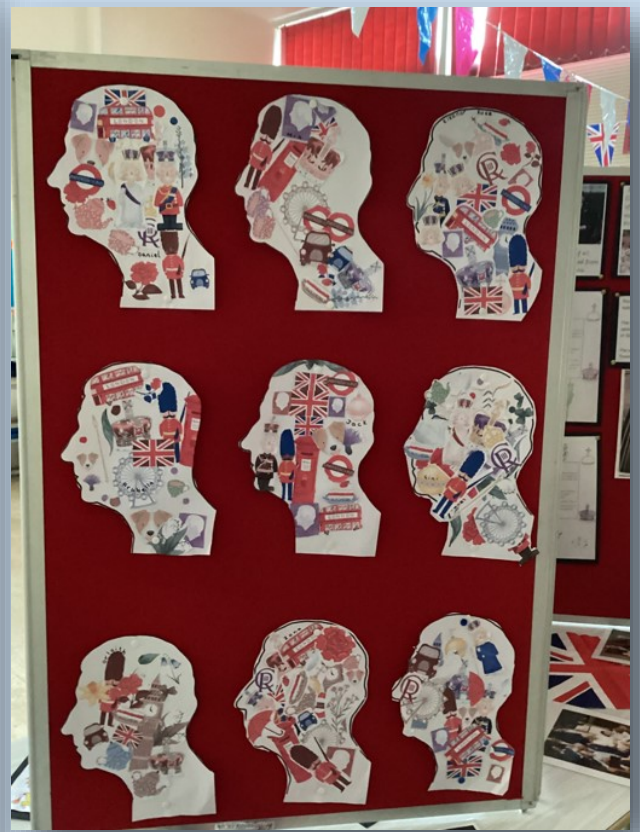

## Attendance

At Provost Williams we take attendance and punctuality very seriously. We aim to have an attendance figure in excess of the national average of 96.7%. Attendance data is tracked by the Department for Education because we know that a child's attendance has a direct impact on their learning. Those children who are regularly absent from school and regularly late do not achieve their potential and do fall behind in class. Please support the school in this by ensuring that your child attends school regularly and arrives ready to learn and on time.

This term, to balance our previous whole class rewards, we will be acknowledging individual attendance. It will also be over a longer period of time unlike the non-uniform reward which was weekly. Children who **achieve 97% attendance** for the period of Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May to Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> May will be invited to take part in a well-being session on the Thursday (25<sup>th</sup> May) afternoon. This will include crafts, personal challenge activities, rounders/cricket and a cup stacking competition.

## Behaviour

Our school rules are an integral part of life at Provost Williams. They are embedded from the start of Nursery and the same rules apply consistently throughout school. We have three essential school rules that underpin our Behaviour Policy and are used by all member of the school community. They are: Ready, Respectful and Safe.



Our aims are:

- *Provide a positive, happy and safe environment in which children can grow and develop into caring citizens*
- *Work in close partnership with parents and carers*
- *Develop a positive self-image underpinned by respect for others*
- *Give all children access to a broad and exciting curriculum which fosters spiritual, moral, physical, social and intellectual development and environmental awareness*
- *Value punctuality and regular attendance*

In order for all children to learn, we teach every aspect of our behaviour policy and have high expectations that all children will meet this. Those that achieve this, and achieve 'Gold', receive a 'Gold Certificate' and Dojo Points. We understand that some children will sometimes find this difficult and we are there to help, support and guide them to be the very best citizens of Provost Williams they can be.

When expectations are not met, staff will use the Behaviour Policy which allows pupils a number of chances to reset their behaviour. However, when behaviour falls short of our expectation, 'Red and White (Beyond) Consequences' will be issued. These will result in loss of social time either at break time or lunchtime and a letter will be sent home. If a child receives three 'White Consequences' in a week, they will be suspended.

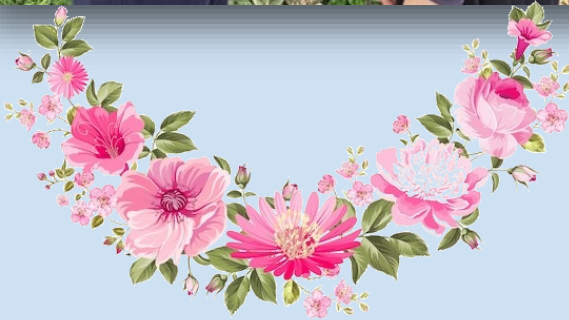

## Mrs Lampe Cullen's Recommended reads

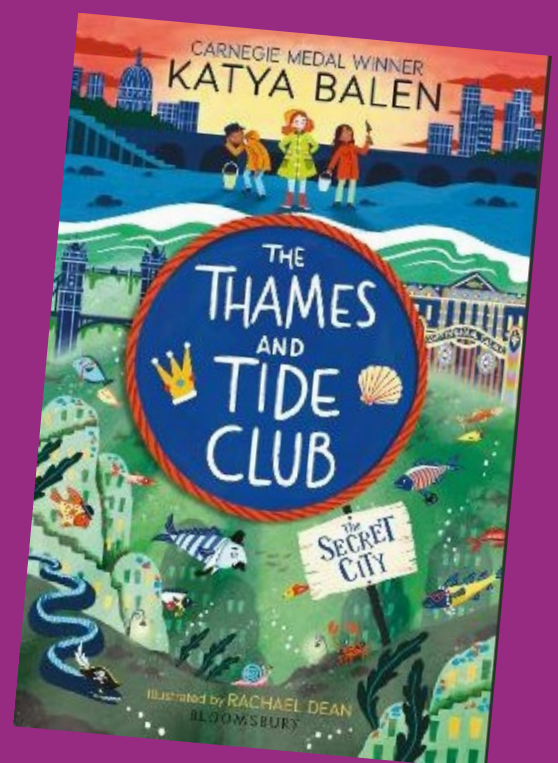
