The Royal Party of King, Queen, Herald, Crown Bearers, Attendants and Flower Girls will be voted for by the whole school. It is a special day for the whole of Year 3 as they dress in their finery and form a procession to the stage where the King and Queen will be crowned in front of the whole school community. This year, Mrs June Backholler, a former TA from our school, will have the honour of crowning the King and Queen. Year 3 parents will soon have a letter with information about clothes etc.

The school gates will open at 1.45pm on **26th May** for all parents to take their place ready for the ceremony and dancing beginning at 2pm. Every child in school will perform a dance so please come along to watch and afterwards support the PTA Gala where there will be the usual stalls and activities. Fingers crossed for good weather!

Still on the royal theme, children have been learning about the life of King Charles this week with each class taking a period of his life to look at, including his childhood, charity work and role in the commonwealth.

We will be holding a playground "Street Party" on 12th May to celebrate the Coronation. More details to follow about clothing, food etc.

Today, both our Chair of Governors joined us for Celebration Assembly and for a walk around the school. 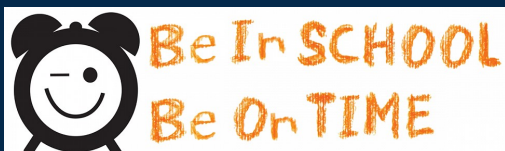
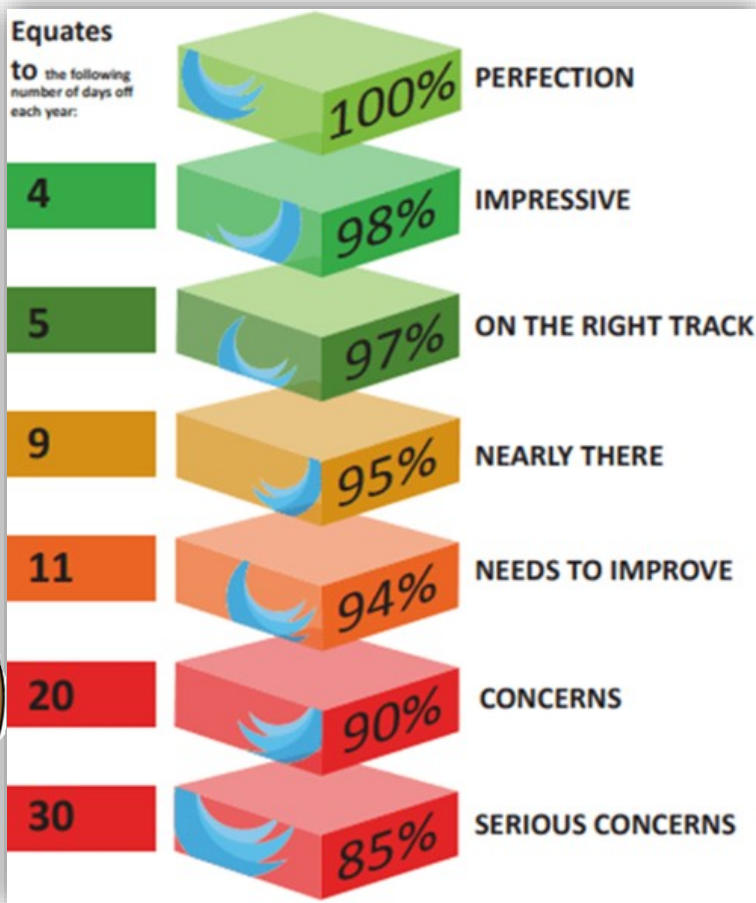

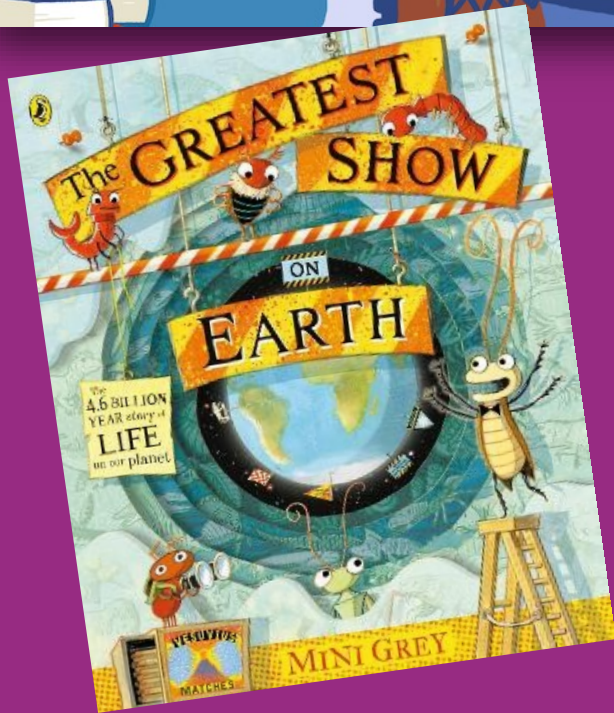
