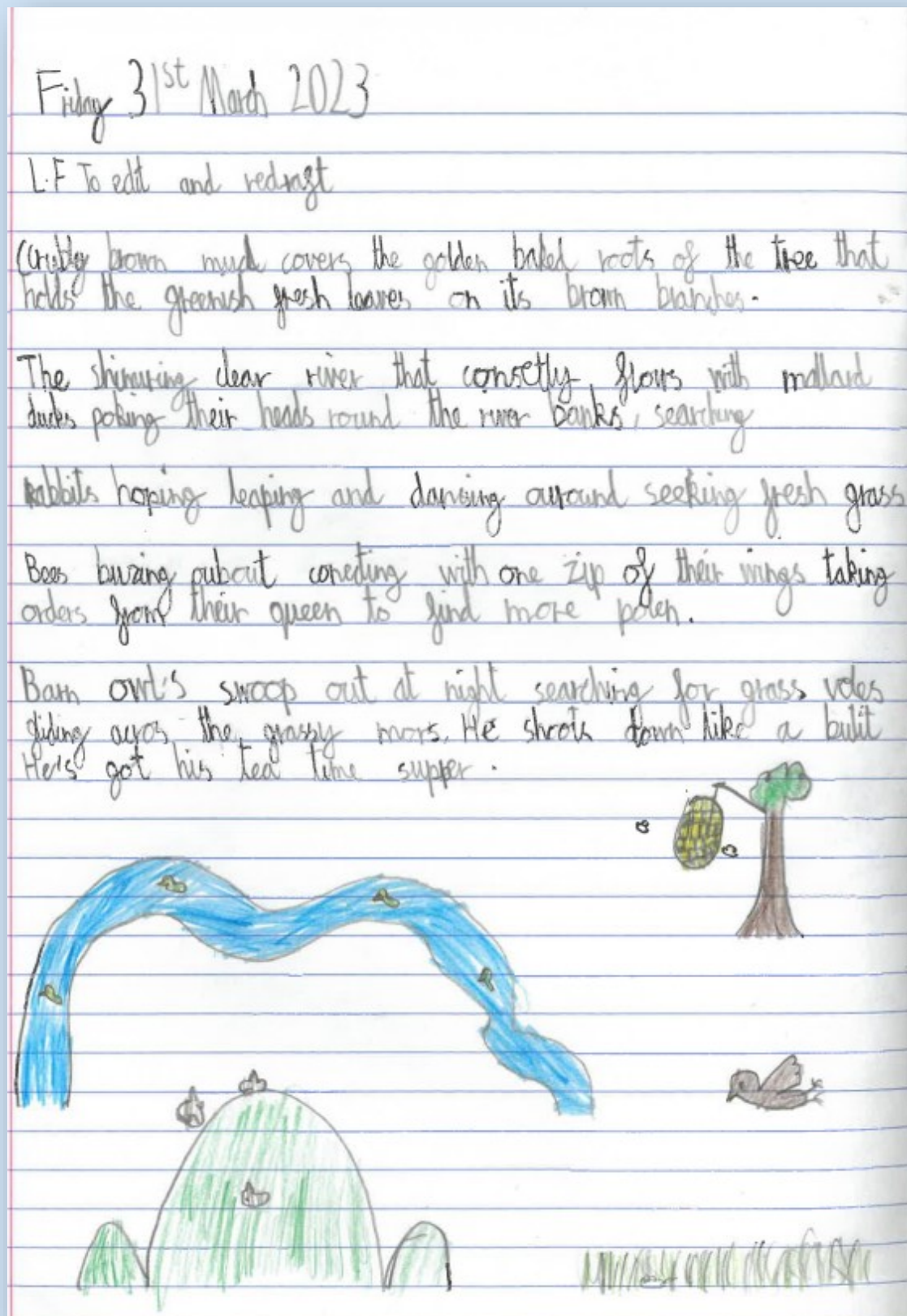


Year 4 have been studying the poems of Joseph Coelho this week, using his techniques and poetry prompts to help them create their own poetry.

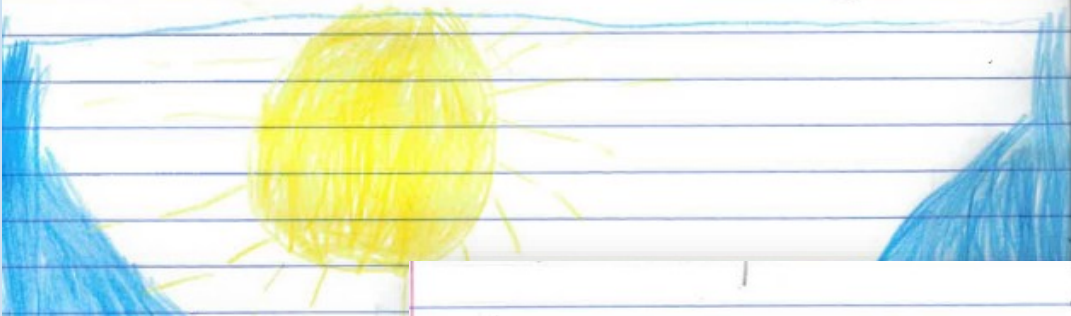
