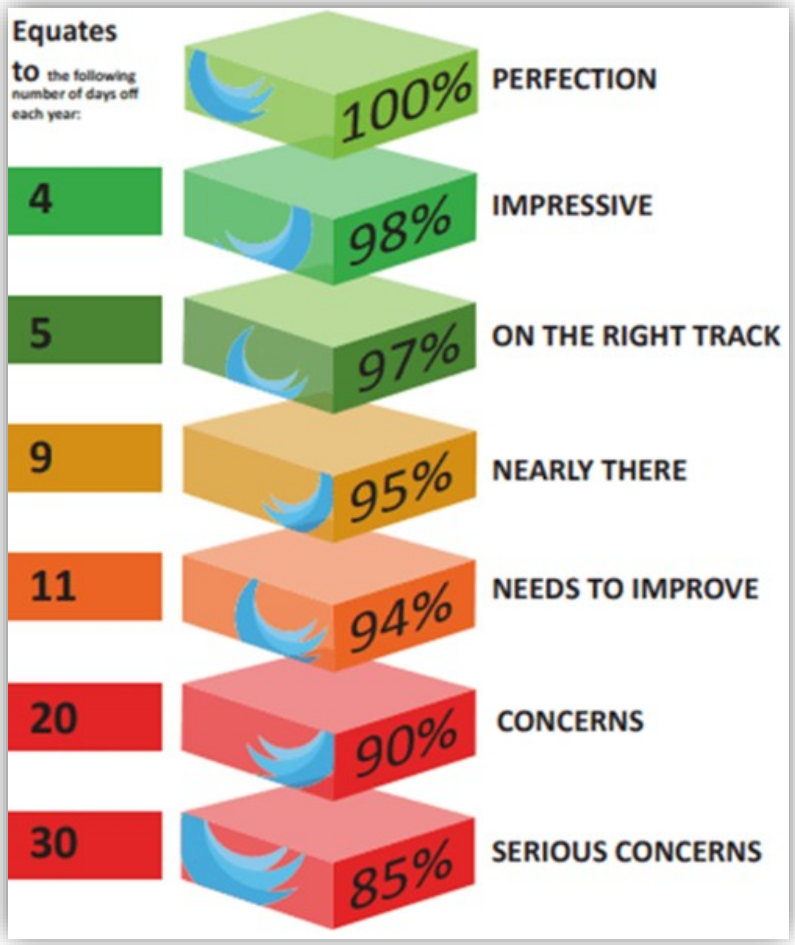
Our attendance this week, as a whole school, is **89.7%**

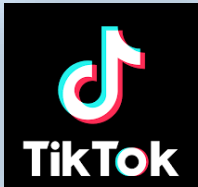


Ark Price Increase from 1st April 2023
