The whole school wish Miss Courtenay all the best for a relaxing few weeks before the baby arrives.

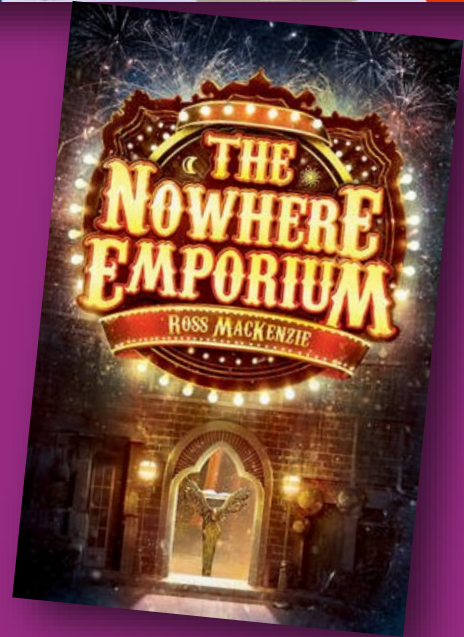
We are delighted to say that Miss Courtenay's Maternity Leave will be covered by another experienced and dedicated teacher very well known to PWP, Mrs Wollaston.

Mrs Lampe Cullen's Recommended reads

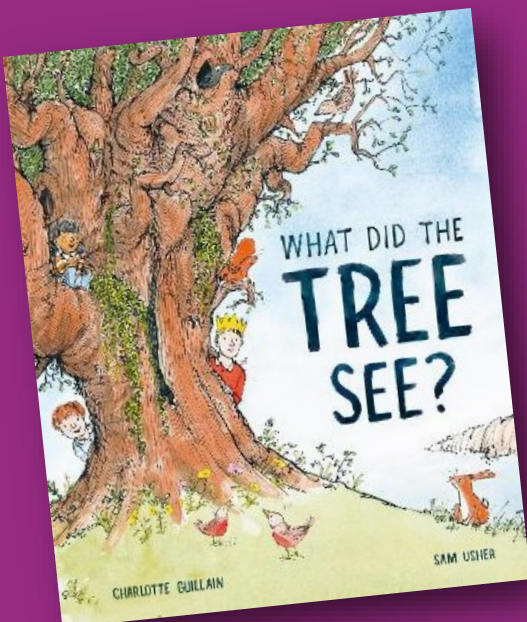
