Parent Questionnaire



One of the ways in which we evaluate how we are doing as a school and develop an understanding of how we can improve the learning and experiences for children at Provost Williams is by asking parents for their views. At the recent Parents Evenings, a parent questionnaire was given out and the 41 responses scrutinised by both the Head of School and Executive Headteacher.

We would like to share some of the key points from the questionnaire.

- The questionnaire told us that 98% of the respondents felt that their children are happy at Provost Williams Primary.

- 92% of respondents said their children feel safe at school.

Although this number is high, we obviously want all of our children to feel safe. We will continue consistently apply the "Ready, Respectful, Safe" policy.

- 17% of respondents disagreed that their children receive appropriate homework for their age.

In response, we are currently reviewing the Homework Policy.

- 27% of respondents felt that the school does not deal effectively with bullying.

All parents are invited to a meeting on the topic of bullying, on Monday 14th November at 2.30pm. PSHE lessons will also cover this during that week, which is National Anti-Bullying Week.

- 97% of respondents felt that overall, they were happy with their child's experience at our school.

We will observe the 2 minutes silence on Friday 11th November at 11am.

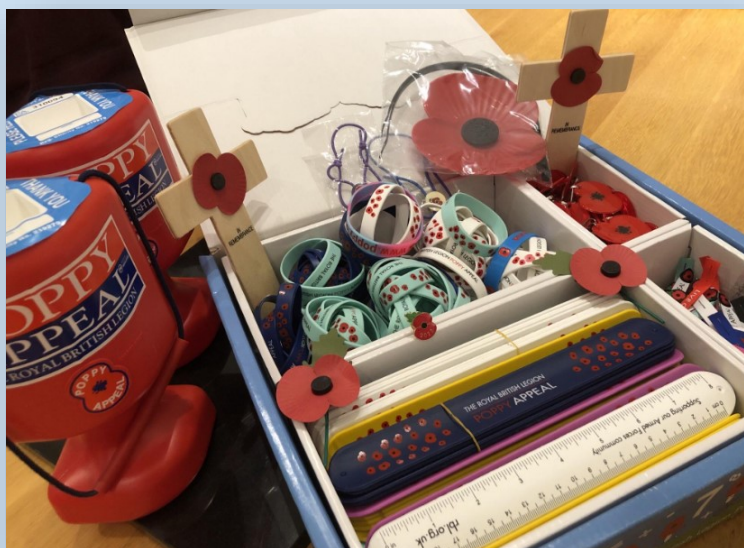
The children will also be contributing work to the Remembrance day Exhibition in Ryton Village Hall on Sunday 13th November 10am to midday.
