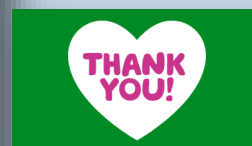
Thank you to all the parents, carers and staff who donated and made the wonderful selection of cakes.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The Government states that every pupil's attendance should be at least 95%.

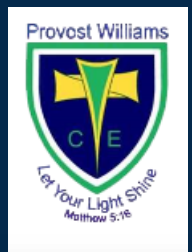
