

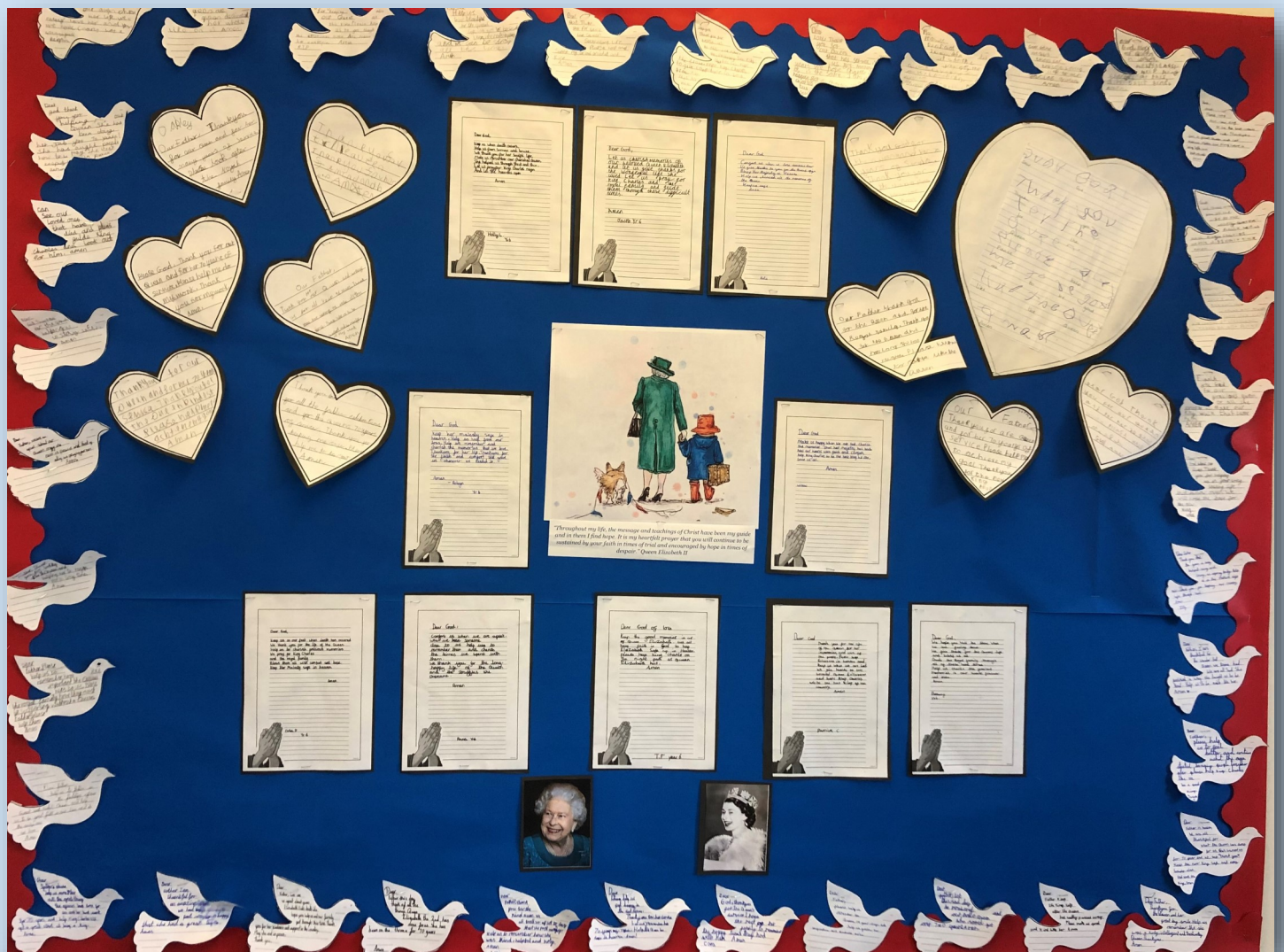

*Following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the government announced that there will be a bank holiday on **Monday 19 September** for the funeral. This will mark the last day of the period of national mourning. The school **will not** be open on this date, and you should arrange any alternative childcare in advance. Please be aware that no members of staff will be on the school premises during the bank holiday.*

*The school will reopen as normal at 8:40am on Tuesday 20 September 2022. Pupils **will not** be required to attend school for an additional day to catch up for the bank holiday. The government has amended the minimum number of compulsory school sessions for the 2022/2023 academic year to reflect that there will be additional bank holiday.*

"Singing is a great mid-week stress buster!"

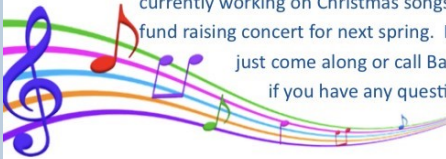


"Our conductor, Ba, makes the magic happen. She teaches the song in different parts and when it all comes together I can't believe how good we sound".

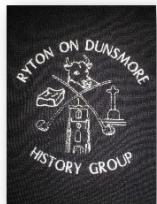
