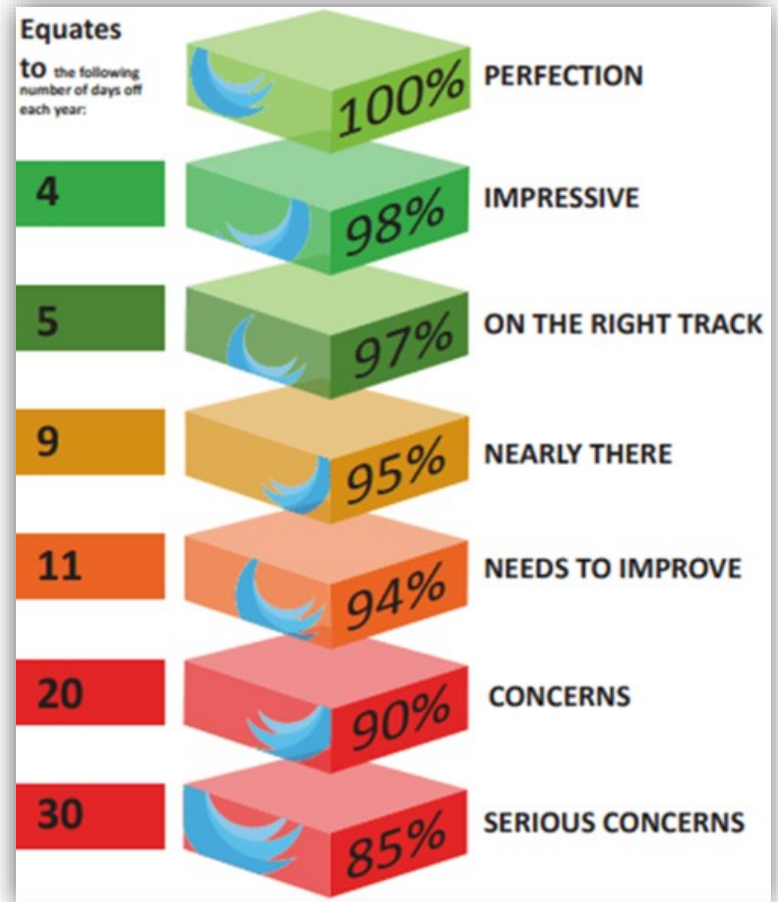

Attendance Update

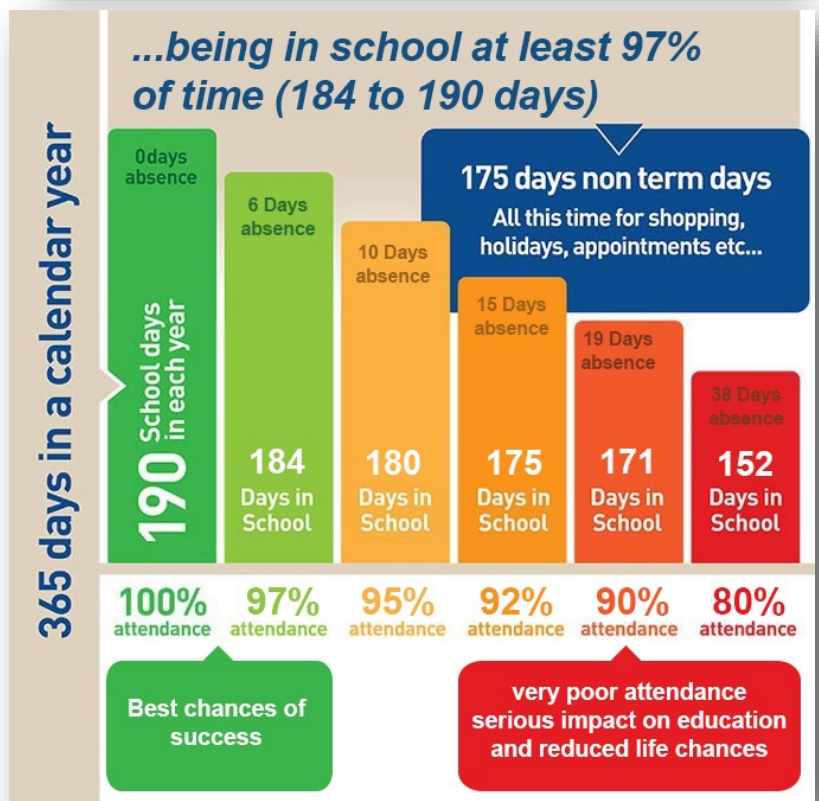

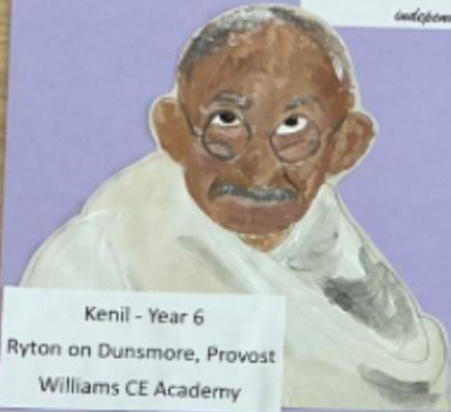

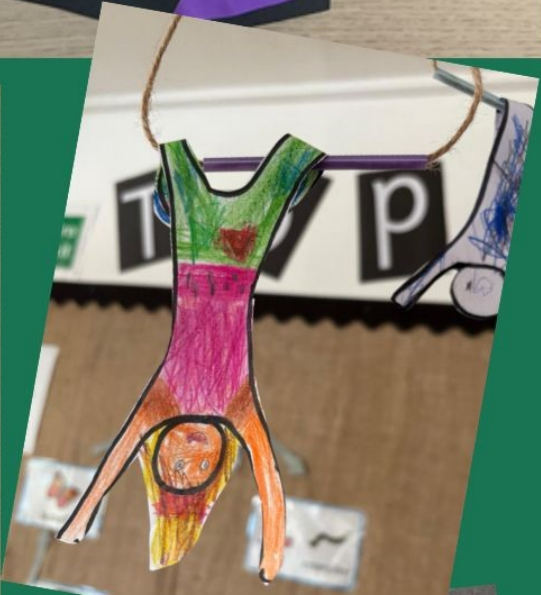
My inspirational person is Olivia Rodrigo. She is an American singer, songwriter and actress.

Group lessons cost £7.50 per session. Individual lessons cost £15 per session.

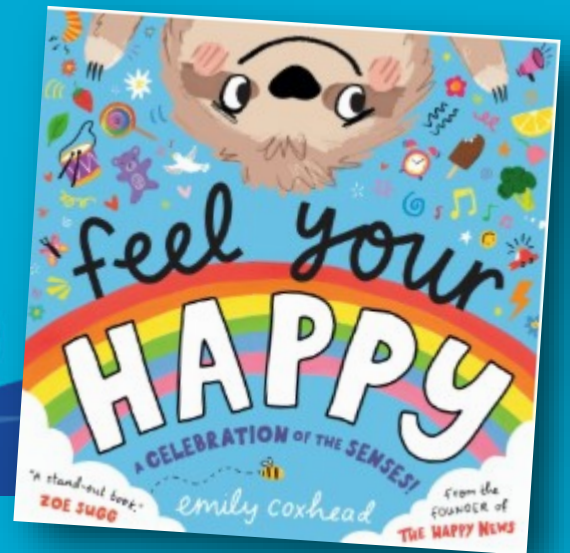
Building confidence

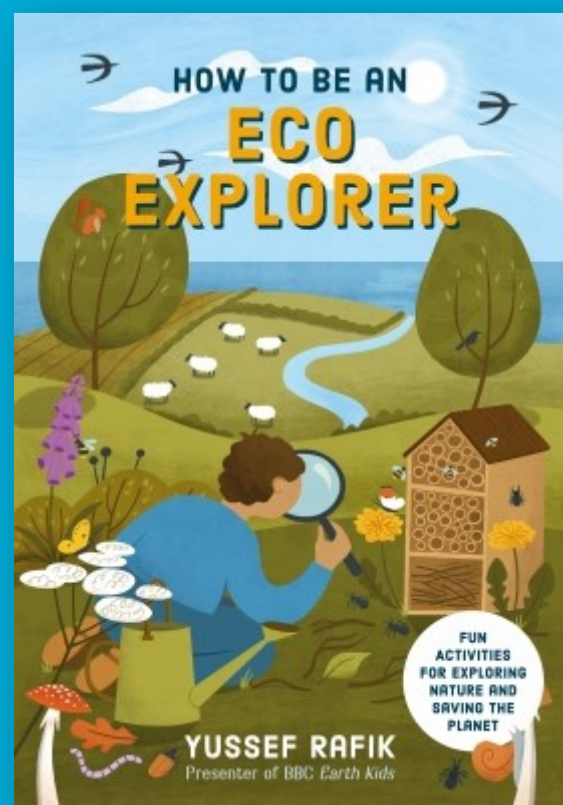
