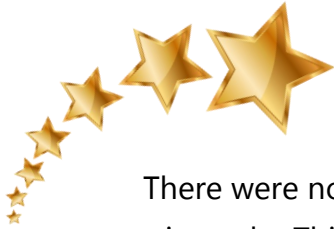
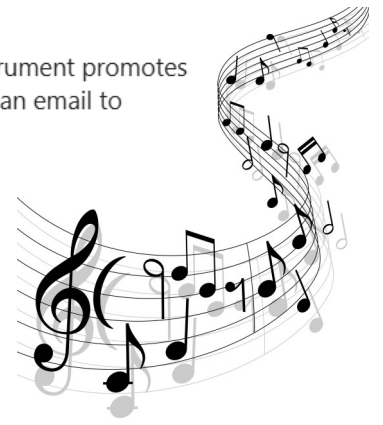

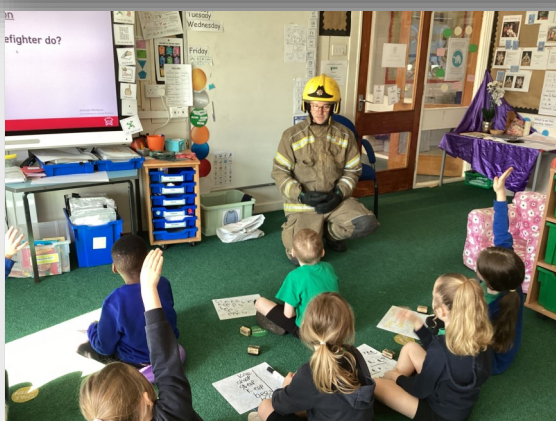


There were no Star Learners last week due to Friday's trip to the Think tank for year's 3 4 5 and 6.



On Thursday, Year 1 and Year 5 had a visit from Warwickshire Fire and Rescue.

Miss Barton said: *"We learnt all about what to do in a fire. Year 1 really enjoyed learning about it and even played 'fire fire' at breaktime practising what they learnt. We wrote instructions to help us remember what to do in the event of a fire. Some children were unsure of their address in case they needed to call the emergency services—can you help them to learn it in case of an emergency? Some children were unsure if they had smoke alarms at home so could you point them out to them tonight? There should be one on each floor of your house. They all know what to do if their clothing is set on fire and can demonstrate."*

Spencer actually got offers from 3 vocational ballet schools but decided to accept a full time boarding place at White Lodge, the home of The Royal Ballet.

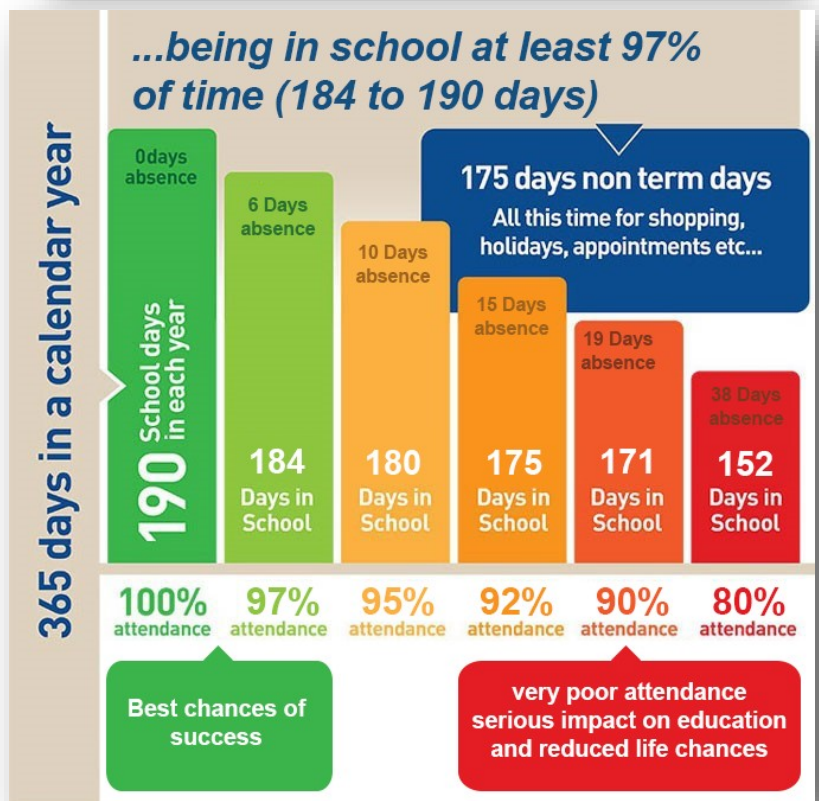
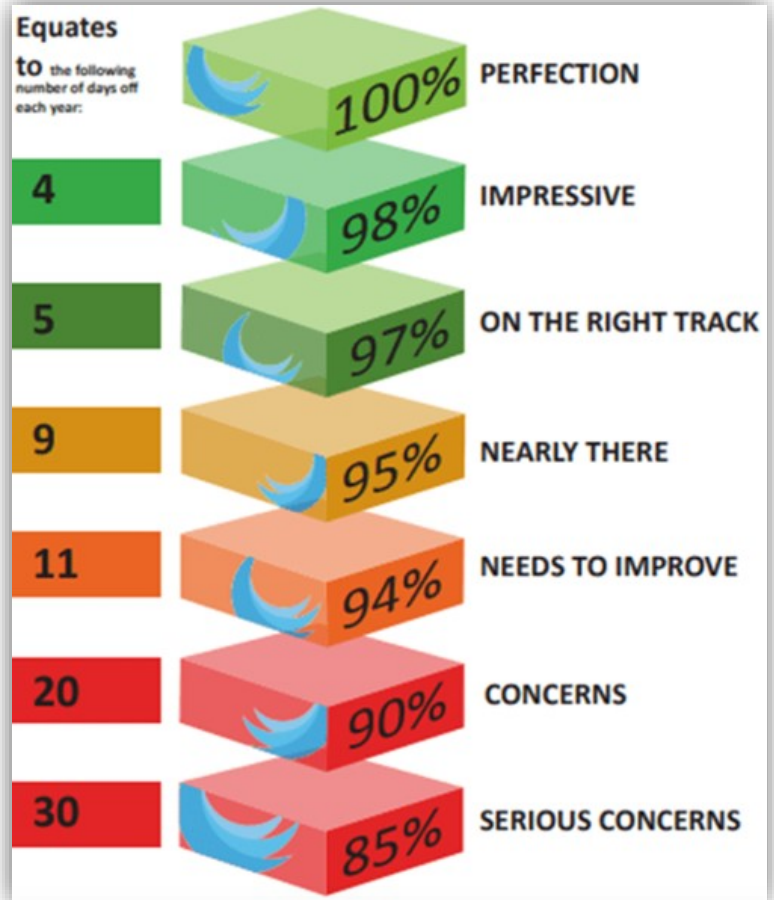

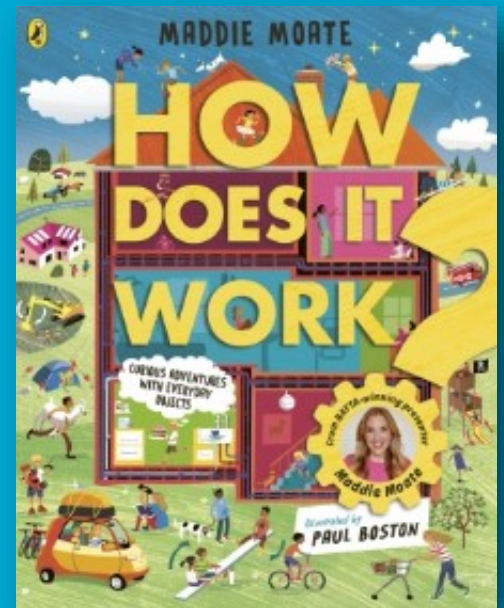


Miss Cullen's Recommended Reads

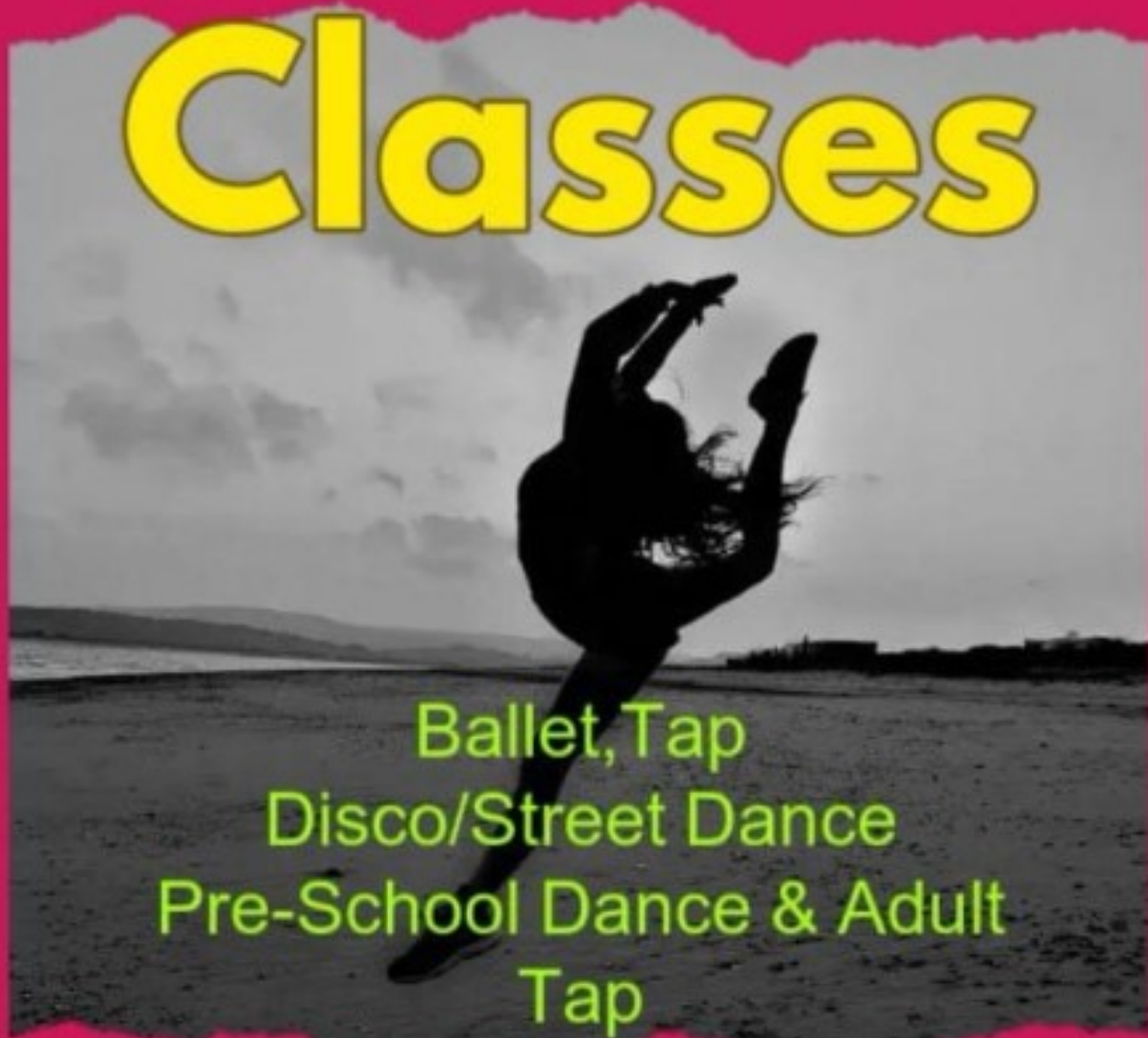
